

Conflict Mineral Sourcing Policy

In current years, there has been an enlarged awareness of an extremely violent conflict in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and nearby countries. Conflict Minerals - such as tantalum, tin, tungsten and gold, are sometimes sold by armed groups to finance this conflict. Some of these minerals can make their way into the supply chains for products used around the world - including electronic industry.

Directed by the Dodd-Frank Wall Street Reform and Consumer Protection Act of 2010, the U.S Securities and Exchange Commission (SEC) implemented final directions to report and disclosure requirements for publicly traded companies related to "conflict minerals".

As a part of Mobitron's obligation to corporate responsibility and respecting the human rights in our operations as well as in our international supply chain, it's our goal to use conflict minerals that are "DRC conflict free".

We expect our suppliers to follow the same guideline, and have policies to assure that the products and components containing DRC conflict free minerals.
